After retiring in 1975, he served in the Retired Reserve for 10 additional years. Pop was a man of service and believed in God, Country and Family. He was a long time member of Miller Memorial Methodist Church in Hinton, and then of Bethany Place Baptist Church in Richmond, where he served as a deacon. A retired machinist for the C&O Railroad and a retired Lieutenant Colonel in the National Guard, he volunteered with the West Virginia Water Festival and Boat Races; played Santa on occasion; and volunteered in Richmond with the International Mission Board. OBITUARY SEARCH TIPS



Enter a last name, full name or keywords in the search box. If your search is unsuccessful, first confirm your spelling.

Next, try removing the first name, as the person's known

name may not be the name on record.

For an exact match using keywords, try adding quotation marks to a keyword phrase. For broader results, search by date or date-range..

NOTE: Archived obituaries are available back to June 26, 2013. We are working to restore older notices, but the process may take several months.
